- Support the planning, delivery and evaluation of a range of projects and activities
- Administration of the Youth Dance Programme
- Work closely with the Projects Managers and Practitioners reporting directly to the Programme Manager Learning and Participation (Dance)

As part of the full-time internship the Graduate Intern will receive training in components from the Diploma in Teaching and Learning.

Main duties

- Providing teaching assistance to Learning and Participation (Dance) Practitioners with a range of courses, classes, workshops and projects both at Trinity Laban and in local schools and community settings which will include children, young people, adults and those with a disability.
- 2. Assisting in the pre-planning and delivery of Learning and Participation (Dance) projects, performances, events, workshops and activities both at Trinity Laban and off-site settings
- 3. Assisting the Learning and Participation (Dance) Projects Managers and Programme Manager with general computer based administrative tasks including data entry, letter and electronic correspondence and maintaining databases.
