PURPOSE OF THE POST

The Dance Science Graduate Intern will join the dance science team at Trinity Laban to provide support for students who are studying on the BSc, MSc, MFA and PhD programmes and assist dance science colleagues with research and other activities/events, including supporting the running of the Body Conditioning Studio. They will be responsible for teaching some of the Lab Skills component of the BSc, MSc and MFA programmes and help ensure that students have the necessary skills to use the equipment properly and work with participants responsibly. There will also be opportunities to work with members of the Health team. This is essentially a role designed to support the dance science department and conditioning studio.

The ideal candidate will be someone who has a passion for learning, enjoys working within an academic institution, has a keen interest in performing artist health and science and has potential to gain new experiences and grow within the role.

Previous interns have gone on to work successfully, within academic institutions and professional organisations as dance science teachers, managers and administrators or have gone on to further study in dance science and related areas.

MAIN RESPONSIBILITIES

- To provide support for lecturers delivering dance science related lectures and workshops on the undergraduate and postgraduate programmes (eg. setting up AV and IT, photocopying, printing and assisting with dance science specific demonstrations).
- To assist with general operations of the dance science office, laboratory, and Body Conditioning Studio including answering the phone and responding to e-mails in a professional and timely manner.
- To assist with organisation and undertaking of the Screening and Profiling Programme involving both student and professional dancers; liaising with the Scheduling Department, Trinity Laban Health, and other departments as necessary organising schedules, collecting and processing data, and providing participant feedback where appropriate.
- To support the Dance Science and Health teams to oversee the provision within the Trinity Laban Conditioning Studio. This will include delivery of induction sessions for students and staff on the use of the equipment within the studio and supervising self-practice sessions to ensure students are using the equipment safely.

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- To assist with wider dance science projects, such as research projects, consultancy and enterprise work; help with documenting processes, writing reports, developing methodologies/workshops and general promotion of our services (e.g. VIP visits, school visits, and other events that involve the dance science facilities and equipment).
- To assist the Head of Dance Science in the marketing and promoting of the department's activities (eg. website, social media) and to assist the Programme Leaders in the marketing and promoting of the BSc, MSc and MFA Dance Science programmes (eg. college and university talks).
- To attend Dance Science departmental meetings and where necessary other Committee meetings.
- To engage with identified professional development or additional training as requested by the Head of Dance Science or Programme Leaders (e.g. First Aid)
- Working with the Lab Technician to
 - plan and deliver lab skills workshops to students, and where appropriate leading those workshops.
 - review and update the lab skills handbook and online (Moodle) information, ensuring that all students using the lab and its equipment adhere to the appropriate guidelines and instructions.
 - assist with the general maintenance and calibration of equipment in the lab, as well as ordering consumables, as required.
 - regularly maintain the IT hardware and software (eg. cleaning and organizing folders/files on the shared area, liaising with IT as necessary).
 - manage the daily booking of equipment and lab space using the various electronic calendars as appropriate (e.g. Microsoft Office, Trinity Laban Moodle VLE, CELCAT).
