- The Co-ordinator will be involved in planning, co-ordinating, marketing, delivery, monitoring and evaluation of projects.

- 1. Co-ordination of Learning & Participation music projects, performances, workshops, training & professional development events and courses, with a particular focus on, but not solely limited to adult learning, professional development, community and student engagement and summer schools,.
- 2. Planning and implementation of project marketing strategies working alongside the Marketing Department.
- 3. Delegating tasks to Interns, student assistants and those on placement, offering support as appropriate.
- 4. Contributing to a positive team culture of reflection, wellbeing and learning.
- 5. Helping to inform, develop and maintain a high quality participant and customer experience.
- 6. Helping to develop the visibility of Learning & Participation (Music) projects through cross- departmental and partnership working, written, web based and social media communication strategies and presentations.
- 7. Liaising with creative practitioners, participants, members of the public, community partners, trainers and other Trinity Laban staff.

- 8. Managing project finances working to financial systems and processes and in liaison with the Finance Department.

- Location: You will be based at the Faculty of Music (King Charles Court, Old Royal Naval college but may also be required to work at the Faculty of Dance (Laban building, Creekside).
- **Salary:** Trinity Laban Staff Salary Scale, Grade 5, Incremental Point 16 -21 £26,202 - £29,725 p.a., inclusive of a London Weighting Allowance of £3,785 p.a. Salaries are paid on the last working day of each month direct into bank or building society accounts.
