#### PURPOSE OF ROLE

The Intern will assist Learning & Participation (Music) team members in the management and delivery of a range of participatory music projects and related training. The Intern will be involved in planning, organisation, day-to-day administration, monitoring and evaluation of projects and programme.

This Internship focuses on the programme of work for schools, children and young people delivered by the L&P department in the music faculty, and will involve working on the following projects and programmes:

- Schools' Concert Series for Key Stages 1 5 a series of concerts by Trinity Laban students for school groups
- Partnership schools programme a series of workshops and activities in schools from partner boroughs of Lambeth, Lewisham, Greenwich and Southwark
- Animate Orchestra courses Creative orchestral courses for young people out of school time
- Lewisham Live Projects a series of projects and events collaborating with the dance faculty and local arts organisations
- Young Musicians' Summer School
- Other one-off events for schools, children and young people, such as the Girls in Jazz Day

#### MAIN DUTIES

- 1. Assisting in the pre-planning and delivery of Learning and Participation (Music) courses, performances, events, workshops, training & programming.
- 2. Assisting team members through general computer based administrative tasks including data entry, letter writing, and database maintenance.
- 3. Supporting the administration across the schools, children and young people programme including taking enquiries, producing and distributing marketing materials, collecting and processing bookings, updating website copy, checking and maintaining registers, contacting participants as needed, monitoring and gathering feedback.

- 4. Practical planning and support for activities and events as required, e.g. booking venues, moving instruments and equipment, compiling plans and schedules, arranging meetings and 'on the day' event management.
- 5. Acting as a point of contact for enquiries from participants, parents of participants, schools, members of the public, professional musicians, partner organisations and other Trinity Laban staff.
- 6. Administering financial systems in liaison with the Finance Department as required.
- 7. Assisting in the monitoring and evaluation of activities.
- 8. Attending/observing courses, events, workshops, performances and meetings in order to feedback and inform future planning.
- 9. Attending Department meetings to participate in decision making and forward strategy.
