PURPOSE OF ROLE

The Graduate Intern will:

- Join a team of staff reporting to the Head of Costume / Lecturer in Performance Design, to assist with all aspects of the Faculty's costuming of student performance and performance design teaching activity.
- Advise students on aesthetic and practical concerns of costume design and realisation.
- Supervise students who are working with departmental resources and facilities.
- Develop skills in a variety of theatre and education practices, including costume design for contemporary dance, costume construction and adaptation, costume stock and equipment control and maintenance, teaching support, and student supervision.

Main duties

- 1. Assisting in the general maintenance, day-to-day operation, and on-going development of the Department.
- 2. Providing assistance to costume staff and students in all aspects of the design, realisation and maintenance of costumes for performance.
- 3. Making costumes by machine and hand.
- 4. Fitting costumes.
- 5. Altering and repairing costumes.
- 6. Making and modifying patterns for costumes.
- 7. Sourcing and purchasing materials and equipment.
- 8. Carrying out weekly costume loans/hires and returns: keeping records and returning costumes to stock.
- 9. Monitoring laundry levels and undertaking laundry of costumes.

- 10. Servicing Dye Room/Laundry on a weekly basis ensuring that dye vats, equipment and surfaces are clean and stock is well managed.
- 11. Oiling and cleaning sewing machines on a weekly basis.
- 12. Documenting studio practice on a weekly basis, via the taking and processing of digital images.
- 13. Providing support in the preparation and delivery of performance design teaching.
- 14. Supervising students in the proper and safe usage of departmental facilities.
- 15. Attending technical and dress rehearsals to give constructive feedback to students on costume, hair and make-up, to ensure the maintenance of high production values.
- 16. Carrying out any other duties as requested reasonably by the Head of Costume / Lecturer in Performance Design.
