PURPOSE OF ROLE

To review, develop and optimise Trinity Laban's IT network capability and related services

- To support the Head of IT in managing the IT department, and deputise in his/her absence
- To work closely with the Senior IT Support Engineer, ensuring that essential systems knowledge is shared between the two roles, and ensuring that system changes are planned and executed safely and with minimum disruption to users
- To contribute to IT and Digital strategy development and delivery
- To manage and maintain the security of IT systems, with particular reference to the IT network
- To observe and uphold the policies and working practices of the IT Department and work in close co-operation with all members of the Trinity Laban IT team

MAIN DUTIES

1. To manage, review and develop TL's IT network and related services

- Ensure and maintain network uptime, monitor network performance, identify and resolve issues. Design and deliver enhancements to the network, keeping it secure and scalable at all times.
- Manage, maintain and develop email systems. Ensure resilience and failover capabilities
 where possible and enable facilities for remote access to services. Monitor trends and take
 the appropriate action where necessary.
- Maintain the telephony system (VoIP) and any associated systems. Identify and resolve issues.
- Implement, manage and troubleshoot remote access to IT and communication services. Ensure remote access services adhere to security guidelines.
- Implement, manage and troubleshoot Network Services (TCP/IP, IP Addressing, DNS, DHCP, NAC, VLANs, VPN, Routing Protocols, load balancing and clustering, ADFS, RADIUS, Powershell and other scripting languages)
- Manage the wired and wireless network infrastructure, including switches, cabling, wireless
 access points, controllers, routers and firewalls.
- Manage, maintain and monitor the TL public facing IP address ranges and DNS, and ensure the resilience of these services.
- Identify and procure necessary network hardware and system replacements, consulting with the Head of IT when expenditure is anticipated to be over £500.

2. To support the Head of IT in managing the IT department, and deputise in his/her absence

- · Identify and delegate suitable tasks to other members of the team;
- · Coach other team members in new and unfamiliar technical tasks;
- · Contribute to decisions regarding staff development, staff deployment, and working

practices;

- Maintain an understanding of the role the IT department takes within the institution, and how the department can best serve the institution;
- In the Head of IT's absence, attend necessary committee meetings and hold regular team meetings. Take appropriate action to resolve issues as they arise and, if necessary, escalate to the next management level:

- Identify new opportunities and IT developments which would be of benefit to the institution.
- Identify enhancements or modifications to existing IT services which would be of benefit to the institution:

- Write and maintain the IT security policy, and other associated policies;
- Set and apply IT security standards;
- Investigate breaches of IT security and take appropriate remedial action, reporting to the Head of IT as appropriate;
- · Report serious security breaches or abuses of IT services to the Head of IT
- Ensure the institution meets and follows any required security standards within the IT infrastructure. To include but not limited to ISO standards, PCI DSS and general data protection.
