- Day to day support for the Dance Faculty (including issuing and returning borrowable equipment, maintenance, and responding to queries).
- Live sound and general and projection support at performances and events.
- Video capture of selected performances and assessments, editing, and distribution.

You'll have a passion for audio visual media, video editing, and using cameras and projectors creatively, and be able to listen to student and staff requirements and advise and support the range of borrowable equipment offered for loans.

You will support teaching staff in maximising the use of multimedia to enhance lessons, thinking ingeniously to assist students in achieving their creative vision in a diverse range of performances, you'll have access to a wide-range of multimedia technologies (including both software and hardware) to help realise these outcomes.

Being friendly and supportive to everyone who asks you for assistance, you will have imagination and excellent writing skills for creating articles on our knowledgebase and responding to emails, have an interest in and experience with audiovisual technologies, as well as enjoying creative problem solving. PURPOSE OF ROLE

The Creative Technology Services Technician is a vital member of the cross faculty Creative Technology Services team, responsible for providing technical support and assistance with audiovisual equipment and systems. They play a key role in ensuring smooth operations of classes and studio-based teaching, assessments, performances, and other events.

Main duties

- 1. Regularly inspect and maintain audiovisual equipment, ensuring proper functionality and addressing any necessary repairs or need for replacements.
- 2. Maintain an inventory of equipment, including recording devices, cables, and accessories, ensuring all items are properly labelled and stored securely.
- 3. Coordinate equipment loans, returns, and maintenance schedules, ensuring availability and functionality of equipment.
- 4. Provide technical assistance and support to students, staff, and other event organisers regarding audiovisual requirements.
- 5. Troubleshoot technical problems, including audio and visual issues, and resolve them efficiently to minimise disruptions during classes, rehearsals, performances, or other events.
- 6. Assist with recording and archiving performances, rehearsals, and related events.
- 7. Support student and staff use of video and audio editing software.
- 8. Uploading content to the multimedia streaming service and supporting its wide range

of use.

- 9. Provide training and guidance to faculty, staff, and students on the use of audiovisual equipment and systems.
- 10. Develop and maintain documentation, including online descriptions and in-room guides, to facilitate the independent use of AV equipment.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE – SUMMARY AND STAFF BENEFITS

Contract: Full time, permanent contract, subject to a 6 month probationary period.

- Hours: 35 hours per week (1.0 FTE), to be agreed with the appointed candidate. This would normally be 5 shifts of either 08:30 to 16:30 or 09:30 to 17:30 to be worked on a rota basis Monday to Friday. Some evening and weekend working will be required during busy periods, for which time off in lieu will be given.
- Location: You will be based at the Faculty of Dance (Laban building, Creekside) but may also be occasionally required to work at the Faculty of Music (King Charles Court, Old Royal Naval College), along with other Trinity Laban sites. This is a role where you would be expected to be onsite for most, if not all, of your hours.
- Salary:Trinity Laban Staff Salary Scale, Grade 5, Incremental Points 16- 21, £29,293 -£32,914 p.a., inclusive of a London Weighting
Allowance of £4,155 p.a. Salaries are paid on the last working
day of each month direct into bank or building society accounts.
- **Holidays:** 25 days, in addition to Statutory, Bank and Public Holidays. Please note, only full calendar month will count.
- **Sick Pay:** Trinity Laban operates the Statutory Sick Pay Scheme, and staff may be eligible for benefits in excess of this under Trinity Laban's own sick pay scheme.
- **Pension Scheme:** The successful candidate will be auto-enrolled into the Universities Superannuation Scheme, if they meet the qualifying criteria. Employees contribute at the rate of 6.1% of their pensionable salary. The Conservatoire pays the Employers contribution currently at the rate of 14.5% of pensionable salary.
