Purpose of role

- To ensure that our users are well supported in their use of Trinity Laban(TL) IT services, and that they retain a high level of confidence in our systems.
- To address and resolve IT Incidents efficiently, so that the business of the institution can continue with minimal disruption.
- To assist with the delivery of projects and the implementation of new technology.
- To help ensure that TL systems operate effectively, by contributing to routine monitoring and system maintenance.
- To contribute to the security of TL systems and data by anticipating, detecting and responding appropriately to IT security incidents.
- To collaborate effectively with members of the IT team and key institutional stakeholders to develop and deliver new digital solutions.
- Supporting the Head of IT with the delivery of the digital strategy

Main duties

1. To provide a second line IT support service to all users of Trinity Laban.
2. Managing incidents, service requests and change requests in line with institutional responsibilities.
3. To respond to requests for assistance from our users, resolving where possible, or escalating to other members of the IT team as appropriate.
4. To remain alert to IT security risks and respond appropriately to IT security events.
5. To collaborate effectively with senior IT team members, to deliver new solutions
6. Managing support with 3rd party and cloud service providers where required
7. To create and update documentation and maintain the IT asset and software licence registers.
8. To uphold the policies and procedures of the IT department.
9. To undertake a range of other duties, commensurate with knowledge and experience. Duties are likely to include the installation or upgrade of corporate software and systems, rollouts of user devices using MS Intune, Active Directory maintenance, Infrastructure and Applications project work, Network and Security project work and routine monitoring tasks.
10. To support the delivery of Infrastructure and Applications projects or Network and Security projects.

The post holder must:

Contract:	Full-Time, permanent subject to a 6-month probationary period.
Hours:	35 hours per week, usually from 9.00 am to 5.00 pm Monday to Friday, (with a daily lunch break of one hour). Some evening and weekend working will be required during busy periods, for which time off in lieu will be given.
Location:	You will be required to work in all sites on occasion across the Institution.
Salary:	Trinity Laban Staff Salary Scale, Grade 5, Incremental Points 16 - 21, £30,597 - £34,218 p.a., (pay award in progress) inclusive of a London Weighting Allowance of £ 4,259 p.a. Salaries are paid on the last working day of each month direct into bank or building society accounts.
Holidays:	25 days, in addition to Statutory, Bank and Public Holidays
Sick Pay:	Trinity Laban operates the Statutory Sick Pay Scheme, and staff may be eligible for benefits in excess of this under Trinity Laban's own sick pay scheme.
Pension Scheme:	The successful candidate will be auto-enrolled into the Universities Superannuation Scheme, if they meet the qualifying criteria. Employees contribute at the rate of 6.1% of their pensionable salary. The Conservatoire pays the Employer's contribution currently at the rate of 14.5% of pensionable salary.
Staff Development:	A range of Staff Development opportunities are available.
Library:	The Laban Library & Archive (Faculty of Dance) and the Jerwood Library of the Performing Arts (Faculty of Music) are available for use.
Car Parking:	A limited number of parking spaces are available at the Laban Building, subject to availability.
