As a part of the Production Department, the role supports Trinity Laban's Music and Dance performance programmes, professional theatre programme, commercial events, and several community and participatory events. The Production Department provides technical guidance to students and staff and advice on lighting design and the staging of performance work, with opportunities to design and lead on performance projects. Crucial to the role is a commitment to providing a creative and positive learning environment, demonstrating best practice and contributing to users' understanding of production as an integral element of performance.

PURPOSE OF ROLE

To be responsible for the presentation of Transitions Dance Company while on tour in the UK and overseas, maintaining Trinity Laban's high production values and ensuring that Health and Safety regulations are met.

When not on tour or acting as the Production Manager, to be involved in the production department activities in supporting the Conservatoire's other academic and professional programmes. Primarily based in the Laban Theatre and working across our other venues and performance spaces, receiving and producing professional shows alongside supporting students' work from production to performance.

To take an active role in the training of two Technical Graduate Interns, with the supervision of one of these as part of touring duties.

Key Responsibilities Transitions Dance Company:

- To take the lead on all aspects of the technical realisation and presentation of Transitions Dance Company's performance work, ensuring the smooth running of the production process and performances and Trinity Laban's high production values are maintained.
- To work closely with the Artistic Director and General Manager of the company to ensure both the artistic and educational needs of the tour are met.
- To plan, communicate, and implement production schedules and risk assessments, including fit up, technical/dress rehearsals, shows and strikes.
- To collate lighting plans in a timely manner prior to the company's production period, in communication with the lighting designers and hold responsibility for recreating the designs on tour.
- To lead a team of staff in the production process, ensuring the smooth running of technical operations, including rehearsals and performance, and to ensure safe systems of practice are adhered to.

- To liaise with touring performance venues and provide solutions for presenting the performance work, including drawing venue specific lighting and stage plans, scheduling and risk assessments.
- Whilst on tour ensuring that working methods employed by technical staff, students and local crew are safe and appropriate at all times, in accordance with Trinity Laban's policies and regulatory requirements
- Take responsibility for some tour finances, to include the hiring and driving of an appropriate vehicle as required whilst on tour.

In house Technical Support:

- To support and assist Trinity Laban students, staff and visiting companies with the lighting design and technical requirements of their work.
- To work alongside freelance designers, directors, choreographers, interpreting their requirements and advising on safety and feasibility of their ideas to ensure the best value and high production standards throughout the production process.
- To assist with the technical management of performance related events, liaising with academic and administrative staff and ensuring communication between departments is up to date via emails, schedules and related paperwork
- To design and realise lighting for in house performance projects such as commissioned dance works, and musical theatre and opera performances.
- To work as part of the technical team and have active involvement in the set up and operation of technical equipment, including fit up, technical strikes, rigging and focusing equipment.
- To programme, operate and troubleshoot light, sound and video control desks and systems with speed and accuracy.
- To co-supervise and co-train the Technical Graduate Interns, one of whom will accompany the tour.
- To contribute to the planning and implementation of developments and advising on capital and resource requirements.
- To engage in the periodic inspection and maintenance of Trinity Laban's technical equipment; including PAT, holding particular responsibility for Transitions Dance touring equipment both in preparation for and during the tour.
